



Roman Around - Year Three Curriculum Newsletter Spring Term 1 2025

Topic (History)

As the Autumn term ends, so does our Stone Age, Bronze Age and Iron Age topic. Fortunately, the children's learning will pick up right where we left off, in AD 43, which signalled both the end of the Iron age and the start of Roman rule in Britain. The children will be learning about the Roman invasion and the Roman's lasting impact on Britain. To celebrate the finale of our new topic, we are asking the **children to attend school in Ancient Roman costumes** on our Roman Triumph day on **12/2/25**. For this event, we have asked the children to make **Roman shields for their home-learning project**.

Maths

We will be beginning this half term by focusing on using money, embedding our earlier addition and subtraction skills. We will then spend the rest of the term on multiplication, continuing to consolidate our 3s, 4s and 6s and also learning to multiply 2-digit numbers.

English

Year 3 will be exploring Roman myths and Gods by writing a Roman myth inspired wishing tale, focusing on detailed character descriptions. As well as this, they will be imagining their own mythical creature and creating Kenning poems to tell us all about their monstrous ways.

Reading

The children will be delving deeper into both fiction and non-fiction texts. They will continue to develop their fact retrieval skills on non-fiction texts about the Romans and will be reading *The Journal of Iliona, Young Slave* to examine characters' thoughts and feelings.

Recommended reads: If your child is enjoying our topic, try *Escape from Pompeii* by Christina Balitt.

Science Year 3 will be learning about forces and magnets. The children will investigate different materials and their properties, as well as plan and carry out an investigations about magnets and friction.

PE In indoor PE, the children will be applying their gymnastic skills developed in the Autumn term to dance. By the end of the half term, the children will have created a short dance routine to music.

French This half term, the children will be learning how to recite the numbers 1 -10 as well as how to say key family members.

Computing The children will be using J2Bloggy to create a class webpage all about the Romans, learning how to select and import photos as well as resize and position them.

PSHE This half term's PSHE lessons focus on the children's dreams and goals, how to realise them and overcome obstacles along the way.

Music The children will be learning about Jazz, including ragtime and scat music, singing using call and response and playing simple nursery rhymes.

DT We will be designing and making catapults using wood and everyday materials. The children will then take part in a competition to see whose catapult can fire a small object furthest.

RW Year 3 will develop their knowledge of Christianity by learning about the New Testament and the miracles performed by Jesus.

Homework

Maths homework will be set every **Thursday**, to be handed in the **following Wednesday** on Atom Learning. If your child does not have access to a phone, tablet or computer to complete this on, please let your child's teacher know. We would also like to ask that the children complete 10 minutes on TTRockstars 3 times a week. English **homework** alternates between paper and Atom, also set on a **Thursday** and due on a **Wednesday**. Weekly spellings are set on a **Friday** in the children's spelling books and diaries, with **homework to be completed** in their pink spelling books. These are to be completed ready for the **following Thursday**.
