N: First today, this man, John Swinney, has been elected the new leader of the Scottish National Party. He takes over from Hamza Yousef, who resigned last week. And it means Mr Swinney is expected to be the Scotland's First Minister in the next few days – that's the person who leads the Scottish government. After it was announced on social media, he said he was deeply honoured to have been elected leader of the SNP. Next Seagull Boy. You might not know this superhero but his superpower is an amazing ability to mimic a certain sound. We sent De-Graft to try and track him down.

(Scene of park with ducks and geese in shot)

D-G: It's at country parks like this where we hope to catch a glimpse of the lesser spotted seagull. (De-Graft appears in bushes holding binoculars to his eyes.) Making my way through the trail, I was hopeful I could lay my eyes on one of these majestic birds. (Stands next to a goose.) Now this one doesn't like me. After many hours of searching, my luck was about to change. **(SEAGULL NOISES.)** (Boy appears dressed as a seagull and steals chips from a young girl before running off.) It's realistic and high-pitched noises like that which have made Cooper an international seagull impersonator champion. He travelled all the way to Belgium to compete in front of judges and scored an impressive 92 out of 100. Wow!

(De-Graft and Cooper walk down a path.)

D-G: So, Cooper, talk me through the competition in Belgium.

C: When it was on the day, I was like, OK, I have got to win this or I'm not going to be a celebrity.

D-G: Well you've actually taught celebrities to do it as well. You taught Olly Alexander, the Eurovision entrant. How did he do?

C: He was really good. Hopefully he wins in the contest.

(Scene cuts to D-G and C sitting on a bench.)

D-g: How on earth do you make that sound?

C: You have to drink a lot and you have to breathe, like, really big. Because just doing the screeching takes, like, half your breath.

D-G: Do you have any more competitions on the horizon?

C: I can do a trumpet noise and I'm planning on going back to Belgium to defend my title again next year.

D-G: You can do it all! So, watch out when you are about to tuck into some food as Cooper's seagull impressions are set to carry on having people in a flap. (Seagull noises)
